

## Tiger And The Raven

The last surviving member of the Snowsong, an ancient bloodline all but smothered by a warlock sided with demons, must enter the forest of the infamous, dark raven prince, Raven Yatagarasu, in order to keep the Soul Gem safe from the warlock's greedy hands. Fairy Tales and Fables: A Collection, is a story of Aesop inspired fables and fairy tales, meant to inspire the next generation of people not to try and conform to the social norm, but to be themselves! The First Tale is The Tiger and the Mouse, by Lucas Hucher, which teaches that it is okay to be different. The story follows a tiger who was born with spots, instead of stripes, and her struggle to find a friend. The Second Tale is The Peacock and the Blue Jay, originally by Aesop, recreated by Lucas Hucher. The Peacock and the Blue Jay, is about a blue jay who was bullied for her looks by other blue jays, and how she learns that true beauty is on the inside. The Third Tale is The Swan and the Raven, by Aesop, retold by Lucas Hucher. The Swan and the Raven is about a raven who longs to have white feathers like a swan, but no matter how hard the raven tries, it cannot change its true nature.

A scholar publishes his secret translation of ten scrolls found hidden under a five thousand year old South American temple. The scrolls tell the story of Ammon, a young man killed in a surprise bombing near his home. When Ammon's friends go to bury him, they find him not dead, but alive. Ammon's friend Taznin leads him on a quest to discover the reason for his strange recovery and his increasing number of new abilities. The journey takes Ammon to a distant mountain sanctuary, where he meets a hidden race of mystical beings. When war breaks out between Ammon's people and their enemies, the battleground gradually moves toward the sanctuary, threatening to destroy the Mystics and free their dangerous, powerful prisoners. Ammon must choose between the past and the future, between hatred and forgiveness, between fear and faith, and between war and peace, and finally, between his own life and death.

The fairy tales and legends of olden China are as ancient as the land itself. They have an oriental glow which can only be found in

the orient. They glitter like precious stones, shine like gold and shimmer like multicoloured silks fluttering in the breeze. They contain oriental wealth of fantastic and supernatural action, not too dissimilar to the tales in the "Thousand and One Nights". The 73 stories herein embrace "Nursery Fairy Tales," "Legends of the Gods," "Tales of Saints and Magicians," "Nature and Animal Tales," "Ghost Stories," "Historic Fairy Tales," and "Literary Fairy Tales". Like the "Arabian Nights," they will fascinate the young reader and amply repay the attention of the older generations as well. Some are exquisitely poetic, such as "The Flower-Elves," "The Lady of the Moon" or "The Herd Boy and the Weaving Maiden"; others like "How Three Heroes Came By Their Deaths Because Of Two Peaches," carry us back dramatically and powerfully to the Chinese age of Chivalry. The summits of fantasy are scaled in the quasi-religious dramas of "The Ape Sun Wu Kung" and "Notscha," or the weird sorceries unfolded in "The Kindly Magician." Delightful ghost stories, with happy endings, such as "A Night on the Battlefield" and "The Ghost Who Was Foiled," are paralleled with such idyllic love-tales as that of "Rose of Evening," or such Lilliputian fancies as "The King of the Ants" and "The Little Hunting Dog." It is quite safe to say that these Chinese fairy tales will give equal pleasure to the old as well as the young. They have been retold simply, with no changes in style or expression beyond such details of presentation which differences between oriental and occidental viewpoints at times compel. If anyone believes that style does not appeal to the young readers, let him open Mr. Andrew Langs "The Animal Story Book", and read to any intelligent child of nine years Dumas' description of Mysouf I., Mysouf II., and Pritchard, and note how soon Dumas becomes a living personality to the child. Then let him turn and read, out of the same book, the account of " Cowper and his Hares." Bess and Puss and Tiney were doubtless as interesting in their way as the dogs and cats and monkeys owned by Dumas; but the child does not care for them - he begs you to read more from Dumas. Young as the child is, Dumas has cast a spell around him - the spell of a sparkling and animated style. Mr. Lang's " Animal Story Book " ought to delight both old and young, as one may find therein pen-portraits of most of the remarkable animals that have interested the world since primitive times. And because authors are, as a class, peculiarly fond of animals, the reader of this charming book is brought into intimate relations with Pliny, Théophile Gautier, and many other remarkable men.
